

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CHRONOLOGY OF SELF-IMMOLATION INSIDE TIBET



TWA pays tribute to the brave souls who self-immolated to protest against the Chinese occupation and decades of oppression to crackdown the Tibetans. TWA publish the names and brief information about the self-immolators in its every quarterly newsletter 'VOICE' to pay homage. For this newsletter, we have continued the chronology of self-immolation from the last edition (April 2015-July 2015). The number goes from 142-143.



143. Name: Tashi Kyi

Date: August 27, 2015

Protest location: Sangkok township, Sangchu in Kanlho

Age: 55

Current whereabouts/wellbeing: Deceased

Tibetan mother of four in her mid-fifties who set herself on fire on August 27 and died, apparently as a protest against China's policies of relocation and demolition of housing. Tashi Kyi, described as a "generous Buddhist" who was "devoted to her family", was a relative of a prominient monk who escaped into exile after a bold protest in 2008.



Although local Tibetans attempted to save her life by extinguishing the blaze, Tashi Kyi died hours after setting herself on fire in her housing compound, a nomad settlement site in Sangkok township, Sangchu (Chinese: Xiahe) in Kanlho (Chinese: Gannan) Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture, Gansu Province. Her body was taken away by the authorities.

These great women were the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for their people and country. We, the members of the Tibetan Women's Association, steadfastly share our solidarity with all those Tibetan brothers and sisters who selflessly sacrificed their precious lives for the cause of Tibet and its people. We will always remember your courages acts and will promise to fulfill your dreams of a Free Tibet.

Tibetan women from the three provinces of Tibet, Amdo, Kham and Utsang, under the banner of TWA, created a history in exile ever since it was re-established in India on 10th September 1984, under the guidance of His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama. TWA is proud to state that the Association has expanded with 56 regional chapters in four continents (Asia, America, Europe and Australia) with 17,000 Tibetan Women as members in exile

During the past 31 years, the Tibetan Women's Association has become a force to reckon in the Tibetan Community as well as in









its collaboration and networking with the local and International Women's Organizations. Due to hard work and perseverance of the TWA's Executive Members, during the 31 long years, the Association is now in a position to take equal responsibility to preserve her unique culture and to maintain a high quality of social and political activism. Today, TWA can claim that it is one of the oldest and most popular non-governmental organization and the only Tibetan Women's Organization

in exile. TWA's continued efforts to focus on the Tibetan issues on the International platforms to create awareness and get justice to our cause has yielded certain amount of responses from across the world. One can boldly say that TWA is one of the organizations that are fully involved in social service in the Tibetan Community. It works towards strengthening our exile community by supporting the education of Tibetan Women and making them self-reliant. TWA's various training programs and workshops have helped many young Tibetans who are in the threshold of their career and life.

TWA plays an important role in raising the serious issues of climate change and its aftermath destruction; Environmental disasters that threaten to destroy fragile ecosystems and disrupt life for billons of people across Asia. Also special attention is being given to the problems of the Tibetan Nomads, whose livelihood is being disturbed by the Chinese government's wrong policy. TWA attends many of the conferences and workshops in India and abroad in order to get more support for the cause of Tibet.

On this 31st re-instatement anniversary of Tibetan Women's Association in exile, we remind and appeal to the world leaders and Tibet support groups to take up the following most urgent issues with the Chinese Government:-

- 1 To urge and pressure China to restart the dialogue with the Central Tibetan Administration in exile as per the Middle Way Approach proposed by His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama.
- We urge United Nations Committee on Enforced Disappearance to pressure China to release His Holiness the 11th Panchen Lama who has been in Chinese captivity for over 20 long years.

 Despite numerous appeals and pressure from various governmental and non-governmental organizations, the Chinese authorities

have not responded. TWA once again urge the Chinese authorities to relent to the pressure put on them as it is a Human Rights issue.

- 3 TWA demand the Chinese authorities to investigate and make public the circumstances surrounding Tulku Tenzin Delek Rinpoche's death in Chinese prison on 12th July, 2015.
- 4 Lastly, we appeal to the United Nations to urge the Chinese government to release all the Tibetan political prisoners at the earliest


WORLD RIVERS DAY

Do rivers have rights?

Do they have the right to run to the sea without being blocked or diverted?

Do they have the right to remain wild and free?



On Sunday 27th September 2015, Tibetan Women's Association and Students for a Free Tibet-India jointly organized a Panel discussion titled" Tibet's Rivers, Asia's Lifeline" on World Rivers day.

To mark 'World Rivers Day' which is usually held on the last Sunday of September, a Canadian-based initiative that strive to encourage



public awareness and encourages improved stewardship of all the rivers around the world.

This time to celebrate World Rivers day, we choose the theme of the event based on Tibet's river and our goal is to create awareness and propaganda on how the environmental condition of Tibet and those mighty rivers become global issues in 21st century.

Tibet's rivers though they flow freely into ten downstream nations without being blocked or diverted and it flourish the food and water security of ten downstream nations (Bhutan, India, Bangladesh, Burma, Cambodia, Laos, Nepal, Pakistan, Thailand and Vietnam). But few decades ago, the evil lurking eye of People Republic of China took the advantage of mighty rivers transboundary nature, they started constructing mega and minor dam project, their mining operation and dumping of wasted industrial material into Tibet's rivers which led to danger of food and water security of ten downstream nations and put the live of 3 million people at stake.

It becomes crucial to celebrate this day as our 'Tibet' is in grave danger due to its fragile ecosystem and it is known by Tibetan as a Ghangjong-The land of snow. But these days question arises whether it should be renamed as land of melting snow as the glaciers are melting at a fast rate due to drastic climate change and unwanted human interference.




Tibet is the fount of the Yangtse, Yellow river, Mekong river, Salween river, Brahmaputra, Karnali river, Sutlej river, Indus, Arun river and Norbu Lakchu which flows through nourishing 3 billion people from Peshawar to Beijing. We have invited three dynamic and well known figures in our Tibetan exile community as speakers of the events and they have presented their topic with wonderful power point presentation. Namely

First Speaker: Tsering Tsomo la, director of Tibetan Centre for Human Rights and Democracy, she had given presentation on the condition of Tibet's mighty rivers inside Tibet and how Chinese engineers have been constructing mega and minor dam project and how they are polluting the Tibet's rivers by doing mining operation and dumping of wasted materials into rivers.

Second speaker: Jyotsna George - Campaigns Director of Students for a Free Tibet-India, she did her presentation by displaying wonderful pictures of Tibet's map with inclusion of its mighty rivers flow into tributaries to the ten downstream nations such as Bhutan, Bangladesh, Burma, Cambodia, India, Laos, Nepal, Pakistan, Thailand and Vietnam, those ten downstream nations are very much dependent on Tibet's mighty rivers for the purpose of food and water security. She mainly focused on Brahmaputra.

Third speaker: Dhardon Sharling- Member of Parliament, Tibetan Parliament-in-Exile, where she had prepared a very attractive power point presentation on nternational campaign on Tibet's rivers. She had even highlighted where she had visited regarding COP 15 meeting at Copenhagen and other places where she had advocated Tibet causes and most issue of 21st century is a current Tibet's environmental condition and how it directly influence and effect the livelihood of ten downstream nations.

OBSERVATIONAL REPORT ON STITCHES OF TIBET

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

First of all, I really want to thank Tibetan Women's Association for giving me such a wonderful opportunity to witness the works of the association. I was really impressed by what they do for Tibetan women and especially the project, which is called Stitches of Tibet (SOT). The people I met here were amazing and I am honored to be with them.

Actually whatever happened in Dharamshala was coincidence and lucky for me. I came here to conduct my research on reconstruction of social networks among new comers in Dharamshala and I looked for the proper place to do that. Fortunately, I found that TWA is running a project SOT that provide opportunities to learn the tailoring for female newcomers since 1995, and they need an intern as an English teacher at SOT. I thought it could be helpful not only for my research but also for new comers who couldn't get a chance to learn English in Tibet.

As a result, I learned from the girls of SOT more than I taught. I started from May to December of 2015 except July and August. It was almost 6 months being with the ladies of SOT. The class was only one hour, however, I used to stay more than 3 hours because chatting with them was really pleasure. We talked not only about English but also their lives. They used to tell me how they think of the situation as refugees,





how difficult the Tibetan women's lives are, sometime, how they enjoy their daily lives. We are not definitely in same situation, but we could share our thoughts and feelings. We were nothing but friends beyond the classroom.

In other hand, six months is not that long to understand people, so I cannot say I understand Tibetan women well. By the way, I can say that they are stronger than others for sure. They are human beings who have lot of problems and they are even refugees. I cannot imagine how they deal with it. They, however, usually think in positive way, always try to have hopes for the future, and help others even though they also have difficulties in their lives. I think it is because of the way of seeing the world according to Buddhism and the teachings of Dalai Lama. This overwhelms me and it has been a really tremendous experience for me.


So again, I really thank all of you for letting me be with you. I will never forget about the time we spent together and your kindness.

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



INTRODUCTION:-

Tibetan Democracy: - Tibetan people are extremely blessed with a leader like

His Holiness the Dalai Lama whose vision of future democratic Tibet saw its first phase of fruition with the establishment of the Tibetan Government in exile in 1959 and the successive establishment of Tibetan Democracy the subsequent year.

The Tibetan Democracy underwent big changes since 2000, during which His Holiness the Dalai Lama made a landmark decision that called for the office of the Kalon Tripa to be directly elected by the Tibetan people. This empowered the Tibetan people to recognize their rights and responsibilities as an individual in a society and participate in voting. This will further, strengthen and solidify the Tibetan Government as a justly operating democracy in line with international norms

Compared to the earlier elections, 2011 election for Kalon Tripa was far more impressive because of improved people's participation in voting. As an Organization dedicated to informing and empowering the Tibetan Community, TWA initiated to reverse the cycle of poor voter participation and the voter turnout for 2011 was far more satisfactory than 2000.

As we are in the mid of the second election for Kalon Tripa (Sikyong) and the members of Parliament in 2015-2016, Tibetan Women's Association geared up to outreach the Tibetan community in remote corners of India, Nepal and Bhutan to teach them how important it is for every Tibetan to vote for their representatives from among many eligible candidates for the post of Kalon Tripa as well as members of the Parliament. To make this workshop more effective, the TWA executives introduced simple and attractive workshop methods such as using both English and Tibetan languages with Power Point which could be easily understood by both young and old.

Every workshop started with brainstorming of the participants and group interactive sessions which opened up the minds and the workshop become more interesting. The discussions become more focussed on Democracy, Human Rights and individual's rights and responsibilities in a Democratic Government in Exile. The participants appreciated the TWA's efforts to educate the general public on Democracy and Voting procedures during the election.

TWA's sincere hope is that all Tibetans take this opportunity to utilize their democratic rights to determine their political future, and come forward to vote for Kalon Tripa (Sikyong) and the members of the Parliament with full enthusiasm and make 2015-2016 election the most successful one

LADAKH: -



Tibetan Women's Association President Dolma Yangchen and General Secretary Tsering Choezom reached Ladakh and were received by the President of Regional Chapter Mrs. Karma Rinzin Palmo. The workshop on Democracy and Election was conducted for 6 days at two different locations.

Each location has 75 and 50 participants. The workshop was conducted in the respective Community Halls as per schedule given to them. At both the locations of the workshop we had the following guests: - Mr. Dhundup Gyalpo (Coordinator of the Settlement Office), Mr. Wang Thinlay (President of Tibetan Co-operative Society), Mr. Tsetan Dorjee (Vice President of Local Assembly), Mr. Choedar Tashi (President of Local Freedom Movement) and Camp Leaders. All the participants were women between the ages 22 to 70. Even the guests also participated throughout the workshop and led the groups during the discussion. This was very helpful to us.



The President of Tibetan Women's Association started with the topic DEMOCRACY and ELECTION. By then the participants were fully prepared to get involved as much as possible in the workshop. This was a workshop which mainly focused on creating awareness among the participants who are less knowledgeable on Democracy and Importance of participating in election. As the workshop progressed the participants were divided into 6 groups having 10 participants in each. Everyone took active role in the discussion and read out their group presentation.

To keep the participants more active and alert, games were arranged. They took lots of interest in learning about Democracy and its benefits.

They appreciated the Tibetan Women's Association's effort to come to their doors to give knowledge and create more awareness on the importance of their participation in election.

The participants were given training on Democracy & Importance and procedures of the forth coming Tibetan Exile Governments election for Sikyong and Members of Parliament. The training was given in Tibetan language as well as in English with the help of PowerPoint presentation. The participants were divided into groups and discussions were held among themselves after which they were made to present the group presentation on the charts. The participants were served refreshments and lunch.

Compared to previous years we have observed that due to TWA's time-to-time efforts on giving training on Democracy and Importance of election, people have taken lots of interest in getting involved. Over all, the workshop was quite successful and participants found it very useful for the forth coming election.



RTWA SHIMLA



We were informed by the Regional Vice-President that all the Tibetans in Shimla are scattered in three areas and their livelihood is mainly based on several petty business. Hence, many have already left for winter business and there was difficulty in gathering people for the workshop. After knowing this we approached the Settlement Officer with a request to inform the respective camp leaders to arrange as many people as possible for the workshop.

The workshop started at 10am with the Settlement Officer Mr. Tsering Tashi, Mr. Tenzin (People's Representative), Mr. Tenzin Yeshi (Local Freedom Movement) and Mr. Tashi (Regional Tibetan Youth Congress). There were over 65 participants between the ages 20 to 65. The Settlement Officer inaugurated the workshop with a brief speech on the importance of this workshop. He also took part in the workshop till lunch time. The participants were quite excited to learn about Democracy and the Importance of voting for their future leaders.



The workshop started with a brief introduction on the Tibetan Women's Association and its activities in the Tibetan Community. Participants were divided into mixed groups and made to discuss the points and put it on the chart. Each group presented their presentation to the larger groups.

We were happy that every participant took active role in the discussion and questions/answers session.

RTWA MANALI

Since 10th September was the 31st Anniversary of Tibetan Women's Association's re-establishment in exile. The Regional Chapter had organized a brief function in the morning followed by workshop. The Settlement Officer was kind enough to give an introduction on the workshop and he took part in the workshop for an hour. The participants were a mixture of men, women of different age groups. Over all there were 73 participants. After a brief introduction on the Tibetan Women's Association, the participants were introduced to the subject Democracy, Election's rules and regulations. The participants were



asked to introduce themselves and later they were divided into groups of ten. Here we found that some of women participants were too shy or reluctant to speak out in the beginning but after getting involved in a group discussion they could speak out their minds.

RTWA PONDOH TASHILING

Pondoh Tashiling is a very small Settlement populated mostly with the elder people. At the start when we spoke to the Settlement Officer about the workshop, he informed that the settlement is very small and most of the younger people were either on their business or working elsewhere. At that time there were very few elderly people living in the settlement.





There were 32 elderly participants who were mostly men. The Settlement Officer Mr. Tenzin Lekshey la accompanied by representative of Local Freedom Movement, Regional Tibetan Representative and Camp leader took part in the workshop. Mr. Tenzin Lekshey la introduced TWA's President and the General Secretary to the participants. The participants took keen interest in the workshop. Some of them were quite knowledgeable and they could understand the importance of Democracy and Election. There were lots of questions from many of them including women. They expressed the usefulness of this workshop and their gratitude to TWA.

RTWA DALHOUSIE



The executive members of the Regional Chapter have gathered good number of participants with the help of Settlement Officer. The total numbers of participants were around 60 (men, women of different age groups.) All of them were quite active as the workshop progressed. The participants were divided into groups. They were asked to have discussion on Democracy and Election. By going through the charts submitted by the groups we were happy to learn that now the Tibetan people on the whole are quite knowledgeable about Democracy and importance of participating in Election.

At the end many of them came up with questions and suggestions. They expressed the benefit of this workshop and requested us to conduct more workshops of this kind in the future.

RTWA BIR:-

There were less Tibetans in Bir because most of the younger people were doing sweater business. The number of the participants is 45 and they were mostly women. The participants participated eagerly in the

The workshop was held in S.O.S Home Hall and it was attended by so many men and women. The participants showed very good response as the method that TWA used in this workshop was very simple and understandable even to those who are not educated.



The participants took lots of interest in group discussions which boosted the confidence of some of the participants who were not able to speak out in the beginning. Over all the workshop went on very well and even the elder people commented that this type of workshop is much needed for the people who are not aware of the importance of Democratic system.

RTWA RAJPUR:-



Although the overall population in Rajpur is low because it is not a big Settlement and people living there are scattered in small groups. One of the good parts of Rajpur is that they have handicraft centre where a number of women are employed and many of them are also members of Regional Tibetan Women's Association. The number of participants is 96. The participants were ages between 22 to 79 and most of them were women

They found the workshop interesting and useful as they had very little knowledge on Democracy and voting system.

RTWA DECKYLING:-

On 17th September, 2015 TWA's Vice President Ms. Tsering Dolma and staff Ms. Tenzin Dolkar visited Deckyling Tibetan Settlement af-









ter finishing workshop at Rajpur. They were warmly received by the RTWA's executive members who had already made arrangements for the workshop.

The workshop was held in the Community hall with the presence of the Settlement Officer Mr. Jampa Phuntsok, local leaders (Mr. Tsewang and Cheme) and total number of 90 participants. Although there were number of young people who are educated, most of them were not aware of how Democracy works in the Tibetan Community. As the workshop progressed many of the participants started to become more interactive and more confident in asking questions to clear their doubts. On the whole the workshop was a successful one and the participants were very happy to be a part of the workshop.

RTWA TSERING DHONDEN:-



Tsering Dhonden is an isolated settlement, situated miles away from the city life, the people are encountering crisis regarding water supply and transportation.

We were welcomed wholeheartedly by the local leaders and local assembly. We gave workshop on 19th September. There were 55 participants. People from all aspects of age had participated in this workshop and are enthusiastic to take part in the discussion as well in the matter of sharing their perspectives.

RTWA DHONDUPLING:-





The workshop was held at RTWA Hall with the presence of Tsering Dolma (Settlement Accountant) and Thupten Sherab (Local Assembly). There were 73 participants with 46 females and 27 males aged between 25 to 85 years old.

The workshop was quite interesting as the participants were so active. Since there were 73 participants of different age groups, many of them raised questions to their doubts simultaneously which resulted in questions varying from simple questions like how to vote for the right person and what are the rights and the responsibilities of the Democratic system.

WORKSHOP AT CHANDA-MUNI:



We conducted workshop in Chanda-Muni region as the Tibetans living there were very interested in the workshop. This small village is located near Clementown and the small Tibetan community was mixed with the local Indian families. We conducted the workshop in the Community Hall.

This small community is totally cut off from other bigger Settlements. Hence they do not get a chance to attend any type of workshop which will help them in learning what is happening outside their village, hence we obliged to conduct the workshop and they were very happy and were very attentive during the workshop.

RTWA PAONTA SAHIB:-

The official guests as follows: - Ms. Tenzin Nawa (Settlement Officer), Mr. Kunchok Tsering, Ngawang Lhundup, Tsering Wangduk, Urgen Dorjee, Tashi, Tamdin Sidup, Lobsang Choephel and Tsering Choephel. The training went remarkably successful.



The total number of participants was 62 (mixed of 24 males and 38 females). The workshop was introduced by the Settlement officer and thanked the TWA for taking this initiative to educate the Tibetan community in far flung areas. The participants were divided into six groups. They were also asked to present their presentation to other groups. Surprisingly, all the groups presented their work very well.

RTWA PURUWALA:-

On 26th September, 2015 the workshop was held in the Kunga Rachun Community hall. The participants were only 42 (25 females and 17 males). The Chief Guest for the day was Mr. Tenzin Kunga (Settlement Officer) and Mr. Tenpa (President of Regional Tibetan Youth Congress). Compared to last year we had fewer participants this year as many of them are away for winter business. The participants are happy to be a part of the workshop on Democracy and Voting procedures.

The workshop was held in the Settlement Community Hall and we had Mr. Tenzin Chokten and Mr. Jampa Saab as chief guests. It was attended by 52 participants who are mostly monks. Initially most of the participants were shy and hesitant to speak out but as the workshop progressed they became more comfortable and started asking various questions which made the workshop a successful one.

RTWA NAINITAL:-



TWA's vice president Tsering Dolma and staff Tenzin Dolkar conducted workshop in the Monastery hall with the total number of 62 participants. The official guests were Kunchok and Rinpoche Tenzin Thinley Langdok from the Election Commission, Yeshi Dhunden and Tsering Dolma, representatives from the Local Assembly, Ms. Tsering Palkyi, Lobsang Choedon and Nyima Chungdak from the Regional Tibetan Youth Congress.

The group discussions and activities were taken very seriously. In addition, there were many well educated people among the participants and their positive feedback strengthened the training.

CENTRAL SCHOOL FOR TIBETAN PAONTA SAHIB:-

As requested by the Settlement Officer of Paonta Sahib, TWA conducted a workshop which was attended by the faculty members and the cl XII students of the school. We came to know that it was the first time for them to attend such workshop. All the students took very active participation. The workshop was a successful one.



RTWA TEZU DHARGYALING

5th October 2015



On 4th of October we reached in Tezu Dhargyaling Settlement, Arunachal Pradesh, in the afternoon. The Regional executive members tried their best to gather many people for the workshop. However, the participants were less than we have expected.

The workshop started at 9 Am with the Settlement Officer as the chief guest. The workshop was held in the Co-operative Society Hall. There were about 78 participants, 12 males and 66 females. Among them 44 participants were above 45 years old and 23 young people between the ages of 25 to 35.

PROBLEMS & CHALLENGES: -

The general knowledge of the public on CTA's role and TWA as an NGO is very poor. However after this workshop the role of CTA and TWA has become much clearer to the public. This was due mainly on the method used by TWA with the help of power point and simple language. This was very much appreciated by all and requested TWA for more workshops of this type to improve their knowledge. As it was

our first time to visit The Regional Chapter in Tezu region, we faced difficulties such as crossing a big lake by boat as there were many incidents in the past of boat over turning due to heavy loads of luggage.

RTWA DHONDENLING (KOLLEGAL), MUNDGOD, HUNSUR RABGYALING and BYLAKUPPE

From 15th October 2015 to 1st November 2015 TWA's vice president Tsering Dolma and joint secretary Ani Tenzin Tselha conducted TWA's workshop on Democracy and the importance of voting system within these four Regional Chapters.

RTWA KOLLEGAL:-

Kollegal was the first Tibetan Settlement within our visit to the southern India. Workshop day's program began with a welcome note by Ms. Tsering Wangmo, General Secretary RTWA Kollegal, followed by a short introductory speech of the day's program by Ani Tenzin Tselha, Joint Secretary of Central Tibetan Women's Association.

The number of participants during the workshop was 76, (the youngest was 30 years old and the oldest was 77 years old). Majority of the participants were women.



The participants were very eager to learn about the Democracy as they have less knowledge on the concerned topic. Every participant took active role in the group discussion and came out with the various questions about rights and responsibilities of a person in a democratic system.

RTWA BYLAKUPPE:-

Bylakuppe Settlement is the first Tibetan Refugee Settlement in Karnataka State and is one of the largest agricultural Settlement in south India. It has the largest number of Monasteries and besides Central School for Tibetans there is a residential school supported by Tibetan Children's Village (TCV).



There are two Settlements located close to each other. The first one is Lugsam Tibetan Settlement and the second one is Tibetan Dickyi Larsoe Settlement. Although it was winter sweater business season there were good number of people who attended the workshop. There were 84 participants. The youngest participant was 21 years old and the oldest was 86 years old. There were 55 women participants out of which 40 were RTWA members.

The workshop was held at Sakya Monastery Hall in Lugsam Settlement. The workshop included a short video clip on Middle Way Approach. The group discussions went very well and many questions were raised and answered

RTWA MUNDGOD:-

TWA's vice president Ms. Tsering Dolma and Joint Secretary Ani Tenzin Tselha's ended up their tour at Mundgod Tibetan Settlement near Hubli in Karnataka State. This Settlement is also a very large one with a large population from the various Monasteries.



The workshop was attended by 85 participants. When we saw the large number of participants, we were very happy as this was the last round of south trip. Our executive Ani Tenzin Tselha gave a brief introduction on Tibetan Women's Association and its activities in the Tibetan Community. The workshop on Democracy was started by the vice president Tsering Dolma.

The last round of workshop in Central and Southern India ended up on a good note as the participants were very happy with the Tibetan Women's Associations effort to educate the Tibetan masses on Democracy and Importance of Voting.

The last tour of workshop on Democracy was led by TWA's President Dolma Yangchen and General Secretary Tsering Choezom and they covered the RTWA Chapters in Sonada, Darjeeling, Self Help Centre, Kalimpong, Gangtok and Ravangla in West Bengal State. The last area covered was Jigmenang and Kapchisa in Bhutan.

The workshop was started by a brief welcome speech by RTWA's Darjeeling President Mrs. Dorjee Wangmo. The TWA's President gave a brief introduction speech on Tibetan Women's Association's activities within the Tibetan community and also the importance of this workshop on Democracy. It was a very energetic session as everybody participated with great interest. There were lots of questions from participants. They requested us to repeat the same program in future.

RTWA TIBETAN REFUGEE SELF HELP CENTRE:-

On 22nd November 2015, workshop was conducted at Tibetan Refugee Self Help Centre with 25 participants. The participants were happy



and grateful as we have come all the way to conduct workshop on Democracy.

RTWA KALIMPONG:-

In Kalimpong we were warmly received by RTWA President Mrs. Sonam Bhuti along with the executive members. We were happy to note that they have managed to invite a number of officials beside the public to participate the workshop on Democracy. The main guests were the Settlement Officer Mr. Passang Choetso, The President of Tibetan Freedom Movement and the Local Assembly's President.





There were 80 participants during the workshop out of which majority were women. Some of the guest participants took active role as they are more knowledgeable. This workshop has helped us to understand the procedure very clearly and we will be more careful in electing our leaders in the final election in the month of March 2016.
